Looking Back at Our History

Homecoming Sunday on September 24 will celebrate the 175th anniversary of our congregation. Priscilla McReynolds of the Library Committee offers us this look back at our history in the years 1867 - 1914:

Following the Civil War, the congregation was served by Elders Waller, Pinkerton, Duncan, Davis, and others. Then, R.M. Messick followed as minister, and he molded the church into a more perfect whole. At that time the membership was 300. He was succeeded by J.A. Dearborn, who is remembered as the pastor under whose ministry a brick church was built, including an organ. It was a spacious and elegant building, costing \$18,000, and was completed in 1885. The old frame building was sold and moved to the Jumbo Johnson Milling Company. It was still in use by the Missouri Valley Feed Store in 1960.

The Pauline Class was organized in 1874 and made up of elderly ladies. It was taught for 52 years by Dr. M.T. Chastain, a prominent physician, and continued until 1948. The local Christian Women's Board of Missions was organized in 1878, three years after they had been organized nationally. The name was changed to Christian Women's Fellowship in 1950 and to Disciple Women fifty years later. George Platternburg was the minister in 1886 when the first of three state assemblies was held in Marshall. In 1894, a local Junior Endeavor Society (the forerunner of Christian Youth Fellowship) was organized by the minister, J.B. Mayfield. The Dorcas Class was organized in 1895.

In 1897, B.T. Wharton began a 17 ministry to the congregation. During the latter part of his ministry, the cupola was removed and the front of the building was extended, making the auditorium look like a vast cathedral. The basement was enlarged, kitchen and dining room equipment added, and many class rooms built. Rest rooms and a pastor's study were also constructed. About \$22,000 was spent all together. It was a beautiful church home and the church took on new life and prosperity.

Youth News

This past month, myself and 6 high school youth went on an 'alternative mission trip' to the Ozark Mountains in southern Missouri. (Rachel had the 8 mid-high youth on another adventure with the same organization). Oh, what an experience this was!! Together, we spent several days in the wilderness, hiking, carrying 50+ lb. backpacks, sleeping under crude tarp structures, setting up and tearing down camp, cooking our meals, charting our courses, and much more. Through all this, plus daily group reflection and debriefing, personal reflection time, devotions, and prayer, we were challenged physically, emotionally, mentally and spiritually, both individually and as a group.

There is no doubt that this trip will be remembered by all of us. Myself – I will be learning, and growing, from this experience for months, even years, to come. As with all youth events, I fancy myself as the 'youth leader' the 'adult' the 'caretaker' even. And as with all youth events, I'm usually the one claiming to have learned the most, gained the most.

This trip was no exception. It's safe to say that we all hit 'rock bottom'. We were physically exhausted, emotionally drained, mentally defeated, and spiritually

afraid. We were trying to survive, literally and figuratively, on our own; afraid to trust God with our very lives. We were, as the verse states, "wasting away", yet not recognizing that we were being renewed. We were looking "at what can be seen" instead of seeing "what cannot be seen". This was far from our typical 'feel good' mission trip of serving others who are less fortunate. We were forced to serve ourselves, to create our own sense of satisfaction and happiness. And it was much harder than any of us imagined.

Fortunately, this group of friends quickly became family. We were able to lift each other up, carry one another's burdens, and be the source of strength in each other's weakness.

We were able to find strength in ourselves that we never imagined possible. And we were able to focus on God, see God, and know God. Many, many times on this trip, I went from leader to led, from caretaker to the one being taken care of, from the adult to the least capable. I felt vulnerable, humiliated, out of control, afraid, weak, burdened and defeated. As much as I tried to hide these feelings, we all were so exposed to one another that there were no masks.

Through all the feelings and all the emotions that transpired, this small group of teens did what they do best; they became the body of Christ.
