# "Time to get Busy"

In the movie 'Shawshank Redemption', there is a scene where Andy and Red are talking in the prison yard during a very depressing time for Andy. The ever wise and philosophical Andy Dufresne says to his friend, "I guess it all comes down to a simple choice: get busy living or get busy dying." You've probably noticed recently what I began seeing three years ago. Our congregation is dying. Since 2014 our average worship attendance on Sunday mornings has dropped from 119 to our average of 90 so far this year. While costs for utilities and other needs have gone up, our giving has gone down. Even though the regional average attendance for Disciple congregations is 48 and the national average is 46, are we willing to accept that as our fate and get busy dying, or are we willing to make some changes and get busy living?

I think it's time to get busy living – living as a faithful congregation following God's leading, being welcoming to strangers, open to new ideas, and serving in God's name. This will require some changes in our worship, in our view of what it means to be a church today, in the way we commit to being a church more than just on Sunday mornings, and much more. Change is almost never easy. On some level, change always causes conflict and growing pains. The caterpillar understands the necessity for the change and the pain it must endure when it creates its cocoon in order to become a butterfly.

People are not looking for the same things in churches that were offered in the 70's and 80's, just as anyone building a new house today would not include shag carpet, wood paneling,

wall paper, or popcorn ceilings. New church buildings being built today have worship spaces that look nothing



like our sanctuary. The days of people looking for membership-driven churches (churches with many programs designed to serve the church members) are gone. Those seeking out churches to connect with today are looking for discipleship-driven churches. These are churches striving to follow Jesus' commands in very real ways. Love God. Love others. Offer food and drink and clothing and shelter and respect and dignity and whatever else is needed to the least and to all of Christ's brothers and sisters.

You have recently received a letter, originating from the Worship Committee, about plans to combine our two worship services and make some changes. Consider this the first step as we get busy living. It is my prayer that each and every one of you will be an active part of this process of transforming into a new creation in Christ. Join us in the fellowship hall at 6:00 on October 7 as we discuss different options in our worship service. Then be prepared in future meetings to bring your other ideas about how we can revive, renew, and revitalize the ways we are church in an attempt to resuscitate our church.
